

Access to Standards & Probity Website Pages
(01 January 2010 – 31 March 2010)

Information was recently requested from the authority's ICT department with regards to ascertaining the levels of access to certain pages on the authority's Standards & Probity website and to ascertain on how many occasions documents were being downloaded.

The Web pages that information was requested on was as follows:

Standards & Probity	-	Yourcouncil/standprob/
Local Assessment	-	Yourcouncil/standprob/localassess/
Code of Conduct	-	Yourcouncil/membcode/
Standards Committee	-	Yourcouncil/standprob/standcomm/

The response in relation to this request can be found attached at Appendix A of this report.

Summary of response:

- The Standards & Probity page (main access page) was originally viewed on 47 occasions (unique views); however it was viewed on a further 13 occasions by those unique viewers, resulting in a total of 60 views over the stated three month period. The average time spent on this page was 33 seconds.
- The Local Assessment page was originally viewed on 4 occasions (unique views); however it was viewed on a further 7 occasions by those unique viewers, resulting in a total of 11 views over the stated three month period. The average time spent on this page was 41 seconds.
- The Code of Conduct page was originally viewed on 6 occasions (unique views); however it was viewed on a further 3 occasions by those unique viewers, resulting in a total of 9 views over the stated three month period. The average time spent on this page was 25 seconds.
- The Standards Committee page was originally viewed on 4 occasions (unique views); however it was viewed on a further occasion by a unique viewer, resulting in a total of 5 views over the stated three month period. The average time spent on this page was 8 seconds.

The above four pages were therefore originally viewed on 61 occasions (unique views) and viewed on a further 24 occasions by those unique viewers, resulting in a total of 85 views over the stated three month period. The average time spent on the four pages was 26.75 seconds.

The graph in Appendix A identifies that the month of March 2010 as the busiest time for accessing the Standards & Probity website, although a total of 12 pages (inclusive of the four stated above) were taken into account.

As regards to the information on downloads, the authority's ICT department advised that they could not see any records of viewers accessing the download containers.
