Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions & Embedded Restrictions

MANDATORY CONDITIONS

- 1 **No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:**
 - (a) at any time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at any time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

- 2 **Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.**

- 3 **When door supervisors or other persons carrying out security activities at specified times are employed such individuals must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.**

For the purposes of this condition "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2 (1)(a) Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 applies.

- 4 **(1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.**

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children -

 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -**
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or**
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);**
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);**
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;**

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on -

(i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or

(ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

5 The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

6 The responsible person shall ensure that tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

7 (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

8 The responsible person shall ensure that -

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks are sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -

(i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and

iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

EMBEDDED RESTRICTIONS

- 1 On Licences
Permitted Hours On New Year's Eve**

The restriction on the permitted hours for the supply of alcohol shall not prohibit:

(a) on New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December)

(b) on commencement of British Summertime, the benefit of the clock going forward at 2.00am, instead of 1.00am GMT.
- 2 This licence is subject to such further conditions as are consistent with any restriction imposed on the existing licence of the premises:**

For the showing of films under the provisions of the Cinemas Act 1985

and/or

The performance of plays under the Theatres Act 1968

and/or

The provision of public entertainment under the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions Act 1982) as appropriate.

Annex 2 – Conditions Consistent With The Operating Schedule

PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER

- 1 CCTV equipment shall be maintained in good working order in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.**
- 2 The premises shall be fitted with internal and external digital colour CCTV. The discs to be kept a minimum of 28 days and made available to the Police on request.**
- 3 Ensure sight of evidence of age from any person appearing to those engaged in selling or supplying alcohol to be under the age of 18 and who is attempting to buy alcohol.**
- 4 A drugs policy shall be provided and maintained at the premises.**
- 5 A member of staff shall attend Pubwatch meetings four times a year.**
- 6 Secure bottle bins shall be provided at the premises.**
- 7 The restriction on the permitted hours for the supply of alcohol shall not prohibit the consumption of alcohol during the first 30 minutes after the terminal hour for the supply of alcohol.**
- 8 An incident book shall be maintained at the premises.**

- 9 Any person who appears intoxicated shall be refused entry into the premises.
- 10 There shall be employed at the premise not less than 2 SIA registered door supervisors between the hours of 9pm and closing on a Friday and Saturday night as well as between the hours of 9pm and closing from Sunday to Thursday if the premise is staying open after 11pm on those days.
- 11 Any queue to the premises shall be monitored by door supervisors and any person who is causing a nuisance or who appears intoxicated shall not be allowed into the premises and shall be asked to leave the queue.
- 12 Door supervisors shall ensure as far as possible that bottles and glasses are not removed from the premises.
- 13 If a disc jockey is used on any night then he/she shall ask customers to leave quietly.
- 14 Notices stating that CCTV is in operation shall be displayed throughout the premises.

PUBLIC SAFETY

- 1 Staff shall regularly remove empty glassware from drinking areas and regularly monitor all public area including toilets.

PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

- 1 Music shall be played at a quieter level for the last 30 minutes of permitted hours during which time the level of lighting will be raised.

Annex 3 – Conditions Attached After A Hearing By The Licensing Authority

- 1 The licence holder or his representative shall conduct regular assessments of the noise coming from the premises on every occasion the premises are used for regulated entertainment and shall take steps to reduce the level of noise where it is likely to cause a disturbance to local residents. A written record shall be made of those assessments in a log book kept for that purpose and shall include, the time and date of the checks, the person making them and the results including any remedial action. All records shall be retained for one year.**

- 2 Use appropriate management controls to reduce the likelihood of customers causing noise disturbance to local residents when vacating the premises. This should include placing at all exits from the premises, in a place where they can be seen and easily read by the public, notices requiring customers to leave the premises and the area quietly. (Note, this may also include a reference to vehicles)**

- 3 All external doors and windows shall be kept closed when regulated entertainment is being provided except in the event of an emergency. Any music played within the premises shall not cause a disturbance at the nearest residential/business premises.**
