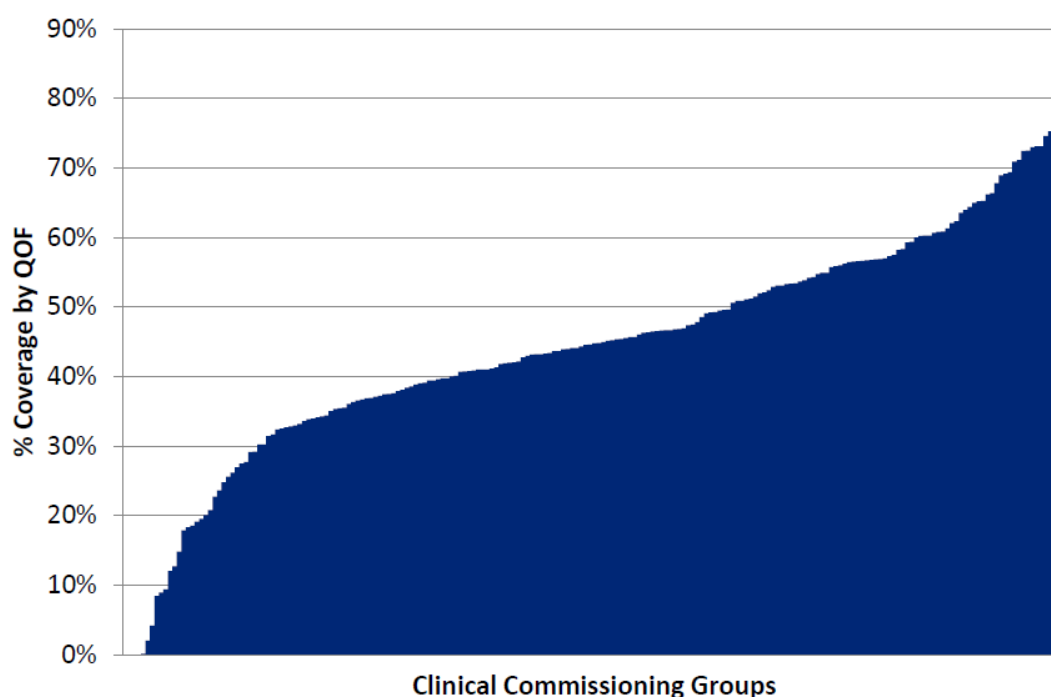

Information taken from 'The Uptake of Learning Disability Health Checks 2013-14 (Public Health England: October 2014)

- The following table shows the total numbers taking part in the health check compared to the number of eligible people:

Year	Number of people who received a health check (% change in number)	Number of adults on GPs QOF LD registers (% change in number)	Coverage using QOF number as eligible (% change in number)
2008 to 2009	27,011	160,165	17%
2009 to 2010	58,919 (+118%)	179,064 (+12%)	33% (+95%)
2010 to 2011 (revised)	73,068 (+24%)	188,819 (+5%)	39% (+18%)
2011 to 2012 (revised)	86,134 (+18%)	198,877 (+5%)	43% (+12%)
2012 to 2013	92,329 (+7%)	206,132 (+4%)	45% (+3%)
2013 to 2014	94,647 (+3%)	214,352 (+4%)	44% (-1%)
