Dear Sir

I write with regard to the Norton High Street, Norton Traffic Regulation Order 2015.

I object on the grounds that limitation of parking will have a detrimental effect on those who work in the High Street area - the very people who man the businesses to which you seek to draw custom - and moreover that the surrounding street parking (residential) will be further burdened, there being no alternative parking faculty on offer (not even a paying alternative). The issue of workers walking long distances alone to a vehicle in the dark in the Winter months poses potential personal safety issues,too.

In the case of Harland Place the greater number of the properties are business with residential above combined. In this situation residents do not have drive way or garage parking nor would have their vehicle near their home. They may not all be at work themselves or may work shift systems which would contravene the daytime regulation.

Whilst I respect the proposal I feel it inappropriate.

Further to your notice of intent re the new parking restrictions to be introduced shortly for Norton High Street and surrounding area, I would like to clarify if any parking provision has been made to accommodate car parking for people who work in the area.

I and my colleagues work at Rosebery Newhouse Estate Agents, situated at 10 High Street, Norton, TS20 1DN. Due to the nature of our Business we need to have transport to and from appointments which can be anywhere from Sedgefield to Hartburn and out to Carlton/Bishopston area so public transport is not an option.

Whilst I appreciate that parking in Norton Village does need to be rationalised, the new two hour parking limit means that our only option is to park on the High Street. This is not ideal as parking spaces are limited and it is a very busy road which makes it very difficult for us to get to and from and in and out of our cars safely due to the volume of buses, delivery vehicles and cars driving past.
